The Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP) provides New York City youth between the ages of 14 and 24 with paid summer employment for up to six weeks in July and August. Programs are located in community-based organizations in all five boroughs of New York City. Youth can apply for the program online or at a community-based organization during the application period. Applicants are selected on a lottery-based system. Employers are encouraged to apply as work sites for the program.

INTERESTED IN HIRING STUDENTS RECEIVING FEDERAL WORK STUDY (FWS)?

The Federal Work-Study program is a form of financial assistance provided to students through part-time employment. This aid can vary in amounts and availability by school and be awarded based on need. Many schools connect nonprofit organizations with federal work study students as a way to expand student work opportunities beyond campus. Nonprofits request to be a work study site from the school and if approved, sign an agreement. The agreement will specify the amount of award (the amount of salary) approved for the nonprofit and the reimbursement the nonprofit will make. The nonprofit agrees that the student will be paid by the school, at a wage rate (within a range) set by the nonprofit. The school will bill the nonprofit for reimbursement. As of 2022, the amount due the employer is 25% of the total wages paid to the student.
